



Chairperson's Report - 2015

2014-15 has been an exciting year for the Pingrup CRC with the introduction of a new funding model, a new staff structure and a revitalised direction.

2014-15 saw a major change for us in terms of the way we received funding from our key government supporter – the Department of Regional Development. With a shift from grant funding to a contract model, our committee and staff worked hard to understand the process. We have made changes in the way we manage our income to leverage best impact. We have also revised some of our service offerings to meet the contract while still delivering our community the types of services it needs.

We welcomed 3 new staff into 3 restructured positions within our CRC, including a full time Manager - Kate, Book keeper - Rosi and Trainee - Tara. All staff placed joined us from other organisations and have brought a wealth of knowledge and experience into our CRC. All Staff have settled in well over the past 12 months, embracing the dreams and values of the centre whilst providing a fresh outlook and direction. Although we have recently lost Tara prematurely, this has opened a new opportunity for Rosi and I look forward to seeing her advance her studies with us and become a full time member of our team.

This year has seen notable increases in the number of people utilising our services, and attendance at specialty programs, in the areas of both social and business development. We have worked hard to strengthen our community partnerships. The success of the Men's Health Night (Lions Club), 65 Roses Morning Tea (Cystic Fibrosis & Bock Families) and School Book Week workshop with Gabrielle Evans (School) must all be noted as highlights for this year. Kate, Rosi and Tara have all gone above and beyond to make these events a success and I applaud them on their efforts. The improvements to Pingrup Post publication must also be mentioned. This publication has evolved over the past 12 months in quality and quantity. Big thanks to the Post Subcommittee for your ideas, support and proofing, Kate, Alison & Maudie.

To comply with the new Contract we have seen the introduction of more comprehensive formalised policies and procedures for our Centre. The commitment of staff and committee to work together on this to ensure we have these guidelines in place has been excellent. This has been a time consuming process but I believe all would agree and a beneficial one.

To Kate and Rosi, I wish to say a big "Well Done", the past 12 months has seen a real evolution of our centre. Both new to us in July last year you have quickly become invaluable members of our team to which I am particularly grateful. You make my job as Chairperson a pleasure and I am proud to be involved.

To my small and dedicated committee, I feel we have embraced the new contract model and I must sincerely thank everyone for their unwavering support and contributions that they have made. The people involved are the core of our centre, their commitment has made the place the success it is today and a place that people want to be a part of.

To the residents and visitors of the Shire of Kent, thank you for your continued support and patronage. We look forward to working with you into the future to make our community a great place to live.

Cake

Ingredients

- 1 cup (120g) desiccated coconut
- 1 cup (250ml) organic coconut milk
- · 1 cup (175g) organic self raising flour
- 1/2 cup (100g) caster sugar

Instructions

Preheat oven 180°C. Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix. Line a 16cm cake tin with baking paper (otherwise lightly grease and dust with extra flour). Pour in the mixture. Bake for 40 minutes or until a skewer inserted removes clean. Turn out onto a cooling rack and leave to cool completely, before icing with this delicious lot of loveliness.

Rosewater Buttercream

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup (115g) softened butter
- 2 teaspoons rosewater essence
- · 3 drops rose colouring
- 1 ½ cups (180g) pure icing sugar

Instructions

Beat butter in the bowl of an electric mixer until pale and creamy. Add rosewater and colouring and a spoonful of icing sugar, then beat until combined. Continue adding spoonfuls of sugar gradually, beating well after each additional spoonful, until mixture is smooth and creamy. This gorgeous icing can be piped or spread over 1 large cake or 12 cupcakes.

Remembrance Day tradition

Why is this day special to Australians?

At 11 am on 11 November 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare. The allied armies had driven the German invaders back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. In November the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted allied terms that amounted to unconditional surrender.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died in the war. This first modern world conflict had brought about the mobilisation of over 70 million people and left between 9 and 13 million dead, perhaps as many as one-third of them with no known grave. The allied nations chose this day and time for the commemoration of their war dead.

On the first anniversary of the armistice in 1919 two minutes' silence was instituted as part of the main commemorative ceremony at the new Cenotaph in London. The silence was proposed by Australian journalist Edward Honey, who was working in Fleet Street. At about the same time, a South African statesman made a similar proposal to the British Cabinet, which endorsed it. King George V personally requested all the people of the British Empire to suspend normal activities for two minutes on the hour of the armistice "which stayed the worldwide carnage of the four preceding years and marked the victory of Right and Freedom". The two minutes' silence was popularly adopted and it became a central feature of commemorations on Armistice Day.

On the second anniversary of the armistice in 1920 the commemoration was given added significance when it became a funeral, with the return of the remains of an unknown soldier from the battlefields of the Western Front. Unknown soldiers were interred with full military honours in Westminster Abbey in London and at the Arc de Triumph in Paris. The entombment in London attracted over one million people within a week to pay their respects at the unknown soldier's tomb. Most other allied nations adopted the tradition of entombing unknown soldiers over the following decade.

After the end of the Second World War, the Australian and British governments changed the name to Remembrance Day. Armistice Day was no longer an appropriate title for a day which would commemorate all war dead.

In Australia on the 75th anniversary of the armistice in 1993 Remembrance Day ceremonies again became the focus of national attention. The remains of an unknown Australian soldier, exhumed from a First World War military cemetery in France, were ceremonially entombed in the Memorial's Hall of Memory. Remembrance Day ceremonies were conducted simultaneously in towns and cities all over the country, culminating at the moment of burial at 11 am and coinciding with the traditional two minutes' silence. This ceremony, which touched a chord across the Australian nation, re-established Remembrance Day as a significant day of commemoration.

Four years later, in 1997, Governor-General Sir William Deane issued a proclamation formally declaring 11 November to be Remembrance Day, urging all Australians to observe one minute's silence at 11 am on 11 November each year to remember those who died or suffered for Australia's cause in all wars and armed conflicts.

If it is considered impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or any duly authorised officer no later than 13 October for permission to provide alternative protection measures. If permission is not granted by the Shire or duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirement of this notice.

PENALTY

The penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$5000 and notwithstanding prosecution, Council may enter on the land and carry out the requisite work at the owner! occupiers expense

5. PROVISION OF FIRE APPLIANCE

Pursuant to the powers contained in Regulation 38A(4) of the Act, no person shall operate a harvesting machine in any course or fine grain crop during the period 1 November to 25 April, unless they have first provided an operational fire fighting appliance, having a capacity of at least 400 litres of water, situated in or adjacent to the paddock prior to the commencement of and during the said harvesting. The harvester must also be equipped with a fire extinguisher. During track raking, stubble slashing and mulching, a fire fighting appliance is to be situated in or adjacent to the paddock operating within.

SENERAL INFORMATION

FIRE FIGHTING APPLIANCES

Council strongly recommends that an adequate fire fighting appliance, such as that which is required for harvesting, be kept in a state of readiness for the whole of the restricted porning period

CLEARING OF TOWN BLOCKS

Owners of town blocks can arrange to have vacant blocks cleared to alleviate the fire danger risk. An account will be issued to recoup the expense. Phone the Shire Manager of Works for further information. David Long 0429 993 987

DRESS STANDARDS

If you attend a fire as a fire fighter you must wear boots and overalls, or a long sleeved shirt and long trousers (non-flammable cotton type). This is necessary to be covered by Bushfire Insurance

AUTHORITY AT FIRES

A Fire Control Officer (FCO) at a fire may exercise any of the appropriate powers of the Chief Bush Fire FCO so far as may be necessary to extinguish a bush fire which is already burning or for preventing its spread. The FCO shall have control and direction of any brigade/s and any person, who voluntarily places their services at the FCO's disposal.

COUNCIL PLANT & MACHINERY

The Council may make plant & machinery available to assist in the fighting of fires. Requests should be directed through the Community Emergency Services Manager. The Shire of Kent CEO or their delegate must approve all requests, prior to plant & machinery being dispatched

Shire only Unless authorised by the CEO or their delegate, only staff are authorised to operate Shire plant and machinery

LOSS OF INSURANCE COVER

Please be aware that on days that a harvesting ban and/or a movement of vehicle ban is imposed, that failure to comply with the requirements of the ban may result in a loss of nsurance cover in the advent of a fire outbreak

Ingredients

- 2 zucchini, grated
- · 1 yellow banana pepper, finely chopped
- · 1/2 red onion, finely chopped
- · 1 teaspoon chopped fresh mint.
- · 1 tablespoon chopped fresh dill
- · 1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley
- · 2 cloves marinated garlic crushed
- · 1 large red chilli, finely chopped
- · 180g mannated feta
- · 1 teaspoon salt pinch of cracked pepper
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- . ½ cup plain flour
- · Extra-virgin olive oil (for frying)


Instructions

Place the grated zucchini in a clean tea towel and press to remove all the excess juice.

Transfer to a bowl and add the banana pepper, onion, mint, dill, parsley, garlic and chilli. Chop the feta into small pieces and add to the mix. Season with salt and pepper, add the egg and flour and give the mixture a good stir.

Place a non-stick frying pan over medium heat, drizzle with olive oil and add 2 heaped tablespoons of the mixture for each fritter. Fry on each side for 3–4 minutes, or until golden brown and crispy.



drumMUSTER relaunched in Pingrup

It's been 12 months since reseller support enabled year round access to the *drumMUSTER* Pingrup site and there have already been great improvements on the previous financial year. The paperwork isn't in yet for 2014–15, but approximately 1000 drums have been delivered to the compound so far. This is a huge development on the 2013–14 financial year, when **no** drums were delivered. This small effort by six farmers will provide \$250 to the P&C.


Having the opportunity to deliver drums and raise funds at the same time can significantly lift farmer participation in the *drumMUSTER* program. With strong community involvement in the Esperance shire for the past four years, deliveries have increased from 6,000 drums to nearly 18,000 drums per year. This equates to a 300% increase during a period when estimated drums being sold by resellers have halved. Farmer deliveries increased from 29 to approximately 120, an increase of about 400%. *drumMUSTER* paid Esperance community groups close to \$4,000 in 2014.


During the 2013–14 financial year, Lake Grace, Lake King, Nyabing, Varley and particularly Pingrup underperformed against comparable communities of Hyden, Kondinin and Newdegate.

- 1. Hyden: 27 deliveries 53% participation
- 2. Kondinin: 23 deliveries 51% participation
- 3. Lake Grace: 3 deliveries 6% participation
- 4. Lake King: 11 deliveries 24% participation
- 5. Newdegate: 30 deliveries 60% participation
- 6. Nyabing: 9 deliveries approx 16% participation
- 7. Pingrup: No deliveries 0% participation

The good news is that during 2014–15, Pingrup farmer participation jumped from no deliveries to 10%. All drums delivered to the compound were clean with the lids removed, so all we need now is for more farmers to deliver.

The process is simple. A small cage near the chemical shed. Clean drums as you go and deliver back to that place. Make a point of delivering drums to the drumMUSTER compound leading up to seeding and harvest.


